

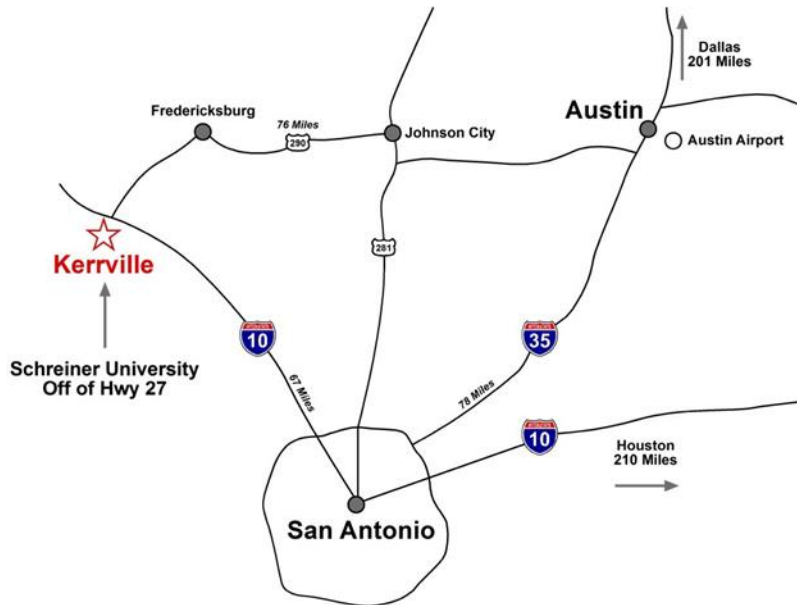

## Introduction

### Purpose of School

The Southwest Christadelphian Bible School provides a week-long oasis where earnest minded people can learn more about the true message of the Bible and God's great plan of salvation. The school is dedicated to the spiritual building up of all our members.

### Success of School

The Bible School committees have spent a great deal of time and effort in arranging a week of spiritual and social activities for you. The success of the school depends largely on your participation in the group activities, your adherence to school requirements, and the manner in which you conduct yourself. We have kept the rules to a minimum to permit as much individual freedom as possible, yet adequate to ensure an orderly and beneficial school. To some, part of the rules may seem unnecessary; but let us remember that there are others who will be offended if the rules are not observed.

### About this Manual

This manual sets forth the mode of operation on the Southwest Christadelphian Bible School. These requirements are for everyone's general welfare so that a week of spiritual fellowship may be enjoyed by all. By conforming to all the requirements in this manual, we will have the pleasure of knowing that each one of us helped to make the school a success and a pleasant stay for everyone.

## Introduction

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### Fellowship

The SWCBS is organized and conducted under the Christadelphian Birmingham Amended Statement of Faith, Central Fellowship. The Memorial Service is held upon the same basis of fellowship; all who meet on this basis consistently are welcome to participate. Members of other fellowships are welcome to come to the school but not to partake of the Memorial Service. In case it is necessary to limit the number attending the school, no difference shall be made between fellowships, or interested friends; limiting shall be done purely on a "first come, first served" basis. However, all officiating brethren and sisters shall be members of Christadelphian Central Ecclesias.

### Rules

Attendance at this school implies a willingness to abide by the rules. It is hoped we shall reflect Godly principles of behavior and show forth in our daily lives the effect of instruction in the Word of God.

### Controversial Issues

The Executive Committee requests that controversial issues not be discussed anywhere or at any time during the school. The school is not to be used to advance individual or group thought of any controversial nature.

## Enrollment Basis, Continued

**Sponsors** Minors (age 17 and under) attending the school without a parent or legal guardian must have a sponsor. Sponsors are to be age 25 or older and are responsible for the minor child/children in their care. Sponsors must:

1. Attend to their personal needs;
2. Ensure that they remain on the grounds at all times unless accompanied by an adult;
3. Monitor their behavior and administer discipline as needed;
4. Ensure they attend scheduled activities.

**Authority to Consent to Treatment of a Minor** Sponsors of Minor child/children must obtain from the parent or legal guardian an “Authorization to Consent to Treatment of a Minor”. This authorization must be signed by the parent or legal guardian and must accompany the sponsor’s “Registration Form”.

## Orientation

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**Your Room** You must furnish your own blankets, pillows, linens, towels, washcloths, soap, etc. Do not remove furniture from your room or any other building without permission from a member of the Executive Committee. Keep your rooms clean and orderly.

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**Pool** The swimming pool will be open for your use between 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm (**excluding Tues.**). Appropriate covering must be worn over swimsuits while walking to and from the pool. Do not leave the pool area while dripping with water. Swimsuits are not allowed in the dining hall. Minors attending without a parent or legal guardian may be required to take a short swim test.

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**Meals** All students should arrive at the dining hall on time, but not before the designated meal time. Once you have finished your meal, clean your table and leave the dining hall to make room for others. Cups, plates and utensils must remain in the dining hall.

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**Restrooms** Keep all restroom facilities clean. Place paper towels in the trash containers that are provided. Remember that others use them too. Do not use the restroom facilities to dispose of disposable diapers. Please bring plastic bags to put disposable diapers in before placing them in outside trash receptacles.

## Orientation, Continued

**Laundry** Laundry facilities are available at Schreiner University. Children are not allowed to use the equipment. Coin operated washing machines and dryers are available. Laundry detergent is not available on site.

**Nursery** Care will be given to children ages 0-2 during the morning classes. One of the parents with children in this age group, or their substitutes, is required to assist in the nursery a minimum of three classes during the week. The classes can be listened to in the Nursery through the speakers.

**Library** A selection of Christadelphian books, children's books, as well as craft items are available.

**Dorm Room Keys** Please return all dorm keys at the end of the Bible School. Schreiner University will charge you \$75.00 for missing keys. Keys must be returned in person to Bro. Fred Bearden or Bro. Ralph Hollenbeck.

**The Chapel** The Junkin Campus Ministry or simply The Chapel is the principal building where Memorial, orientation, adult classes, general assemblies, and programs take place.

## Rules

**In the Classroom** Food, drink, candy and gum are not to be brought into the Chapel where classes and general assemblies are held. Food and drink in all other classrooms are allowed only if approved by the instructor and disposed of properly. Nothing but a sealed water bottle is allowed in these areas.

**Do Not Disturb Others** You must be in your own room, and quiet, by 11:00 pm. Quiet discussion in your own room that does not disturb others is permissible. Do not take showers before 5:30 am or after 11:30 pm.

**Items Not Allowed** The following are not allowed on the Bible school grounds at any time.

- Pets
- Radios, televisions, and multi-media devices such as CD players, MP3 or I-pods for use other than the Bible school needs.
- Skateboards and roller blades
- Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs
- Smoking or use of any kind of tobacco
- Candles, incense, or anything requiring a lighter.

**Grounds** Do not damage trees, shrubs, flowers, or any school property. Do not deface or damage any rooms, buildings, or school equipment in any way.

## Youth Conduct, Continued

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**Gym Policy** Students are not allowed in or around the gym, except at designated times. Wear only non-marking sole footwear on the gymnasium floor. Gym shoes must be carried to and from the gymnasium. No one is allowed in locker and/or equipment rooms.

## Rules, Continued

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**Leaving the Campus** **Anyone leaving the campus must sign out in the book provided in the lobby of The Oaks Apartments. Give your destination and expected time of return. Upon returning you must sign in.**

Minor Children (Age 17 and under) are expected to remain on the campus at all times. Their parent, legal guardian, sponsor, or an adult approved by one of these three, must accompany those who leave the campus.

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**Acceptable Dress** Males 13 and older must wear shirts, pants and shoes to all classes and formal meetings. Females 13 and older must wear dresses, skirts, pants and blouses and shoes to all classes and formal meetings. Dresses or skirts and blouses and head coverings (for sisters) are requested at Memorial Service on Sunday evening.

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**Dress Not Allowed** The following are not allowed at any time; bare midriffs or displaying of underwear. Ladies-Please wear shirts long enough to cover your casual or workout tights/leggings. **Care should be taken that attire does not appear immodest or offensive to others at any time.**

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**General** The Bible School and Schreiner University rules will be discussed at the beginning of the Bible School.

## Rules, Continued

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**Sports Attire** Sports attire may be worn during recreational periods only. **Care should be taken that attire does not appear immodest or offensive to others at any time.** This is particularly important regarding swimwear. No brief swimsuits for either males or females will be allowed. For example, bikinis and high cut legs are not acceptable. (Bring old shorts and a swimsuit you don't mind getting dirty if you plan to swim at the dam.)

Wear only non-marking sole footwear on the main gymnasium floor. *These cannot be the same shoes worn to the gymnasium as pebbles can get stuck in the tread and mark/scratch the floor.*

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**Classes** All students, young and old alike, are required to attend all morning classes except for sickness. Please arrive and be seated before the class starting time and remain seated until the end of the session. Please cooperate with the instructor(s). Do not ask questions unless the instructor requests them.

## Youth Conduct

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**Attending Classes** With no exceptions, all are to attend the morning classes to which they are assigned. Teenagers who have been baptized are permitted to attend the adult classes and activities if they wish. However, moving back and forth between the teenage and adult classes is not allowed.

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**When Sick** All who are sick must report it or have it reported to an executive committee member. No students will be allowed to remain in their rooms during the morning classes unless directed to do so by an executive committee member.

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**Age Group** Children 6 to 12 may attend the youth evening activities planned for them Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday or they may attend the adult evening program. Young people 25 and younger are encouraged to attend the devotional each evening.

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**Appropriate Behavior** Boys must not visit girl's rooms, nor do girls visit boy's rooms. Practical jokes will not be tolerated. These may be cause for dismissal from the school.

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**Mandatory Curfew** Curfew is 11:00 pm and "Quiet" must be observed. You must be in your own room by 11:00 pm.
